

NEW ZEALAND PASSENGER DEPARTURE CARD

How to fill in the card

- A departure card must be completed for all passengers, including children.
- Please answer in English.
- Print in capital letters like this:

NEW ZEALAND

- or mark answers like this:

Cash Reporting

If you are carrying, on your person or in your baggage, cash in any currency to the value of \$NZ10,000 or more, you must report this to a Customs officer when you are completing passport formalities on departure from New Zealand. If anyone you are responsible for, who is travelling with you, has cash to that value, you must tell the Customs officer about that too. Under the Financial Transactions Act 1996, it is an offence to fail to report as instructed here.

Please read this privacy statement before signing

Information sought on the New Zealand Passenger Departure Card is required to administer immigration law, pursuant to the Immigration Act 1987. This information will be disclosed to those Government bodies authorised to receive it under New Zealand law. Once collected, the Statistics Act 1975 allows for the information to be used for statistical purposes by Statistics New Zealand.

The Customs and Excise Act 1996 authorises the New Zealand Customs Service to release information for data matching purposes to: the Ministry of Social Development (MSD) under s.280; and Inland Revenue under s.280H. Pursuant to the Immigration Act 1987, s.141A and s.141AE, and the Electoral Act 1993, s.263A, the New Zealand Immigration Service is authorised to release information for data matching purposes to MSD, the Ministry of Justice and the Electoral Enrolment Centre.

The law authorising the collection of information from the New Zealand Passenger Departure card provides penalties for the non supply of information. These range from fines through to imprisonment. The Privacy Act 1993 provides rights of access to, and correction of, personal information held in readily retrievable form.
